YOUR AGREEMENT: I understand that dogs are not suited to living outdoors and will keep my dog as an indoor pet. I am willing, if necessary, to crate my dog for the transitional adjustment period. I understand that it may take several weeks to months for a dog to adjust to its new home and I am prepared to allow for this. \_\_\_\_\_ I am aware that dogs cannot be tied on a run or chain, and I agree never to tie my dog. I understand that greyhounds/sighthounds must be on a leash or in a completely enclosed/ fenced in area at all times, and that an electric fence is not a safe option for any dog. I will not use an electric fence with my dog and will keep my greyhound/sighthound safely leashed or fenced at all times when outdoors. Dogs can live up to 15 years or longer. An adoption is a serious, long-term commitment. Possible lifestyle changes such as moving, having children, divorce, job loss, cost of veterinary care, etc. should be carefully considered. Pets should not be considered disposable. It can be traumatic and confusing for a pet to be abandoned by its owner once it has settled into its new home. I AM PREPARED TO MAKE A LONG-TERM COMMITMENT TO MY ADOPTED DOG. IF I AM NOT ABLE TO ADEQUATELY CARE FOR MY ADOPTED DOG, OR IT OTHERWISE BECOMES NECESSARY TO RETURN OR REHOME THIS DOG, I WILL ABIDE BY THE ADOPTION CONTRACT AND ARRANGE TO RETURN THE DOG TO GREYHOUND FRIENDS.
